

Issue 1 – Invalid Input Accepted in Venue Field

Title of the Issue

Venue field accepts invalid characters and numbers.

Navigation Path Used



Description of the Issue

The Venue (Campus/Building) field accepts random numbers and special characters such as “9455517@!\$%^&*”. Venue fields should normally accept meaningful text such as building or hall names.

Suggested Improvement / Solution

Add validation to allow only alphabetic characters and standard location formats.

Issue 2 – City Field Accepts Personal Name

Title of the Issue

City field accepts incorrect input.



Description of the Issue

The City field accepts non-city values such as personal names (example: “Sweetie Verma”). This may result in incorrect event location data.

Suggested Improvement / Solution

Restrict input to valid city names or provide a drop down list of cities

College/University field lacks auto-suggestion features.



The College/University Name field allows manual entry without suggestions. This may lead to spelling variations for the same institution.

Suggested Improvement / Solution

Provide an auto-suggestion dropdown list of univer

Issue 4 – No Input Validation for Special Characters

Form fields accept special characters and random inputs.

Description of the Issue

Several input fields such as Venue, City, and Fest Name accept special characters and meaningless inputs like “@@@###123”. Lack of validation can lead to inconsistent or corrupted data in the database.

Suggested Improvement / Solution

Implement input validation rules restricting special characters and enforcing proper text formats.

Issue 6 – No Confirmation Before Publishing Event

Title of the Issue

Event can be published without confirmation prompt.

Description of the Issue

Clicking the Publish button appears to directly publish the event without asking the user for confirmation. This increases the risk of accidental publishing of incomplete or incorrect event information.

Suggested Improvement / Solution

Add a confirmation dialog such as “Are you sure you want to publish this event?”

Issue 7 – Lack of Error Messages for Incorrect Inputs

Title of the Issue

System does not show clear error messages for invalid inputs.

Description of the Issue

When incorrect or meaningless data is entered in form fields, the system does not display clear validation error messages. This may confuse users and lead to incorrect event information being submitted.

Suggested Improvement / Solution

Display real-time validation messages such as “Please enter a valid city name” or “Special characters are not allowed”.

Issue 8 – File Upload Field Accepts Incorrect File Format

Title of the Issue

Society Logo upload field accepts incorrect file format.

Description of the Issue

The Society Logo upload field specifies that only **JPG/PNG files up to 1MB** should be uploaded. However, the uploaded file shown is “**December Habit Tracker.pdf.pdf**”, which is a PDF file. This indicates that the system may not be properly validating the file format before accepting the upload.

Suggested Improvement / Solution

Implement strict file validation so that only **JPG or PNG files within the size limit** can be uploaded. Display an error message if an unsupported file type such as PDF is selected.
